REF: **Operations Report for April 2018**

Fire Department personnel responded to **115 EMS** and **30 Fire** incidents during April. Crews handled a total of **145 incidents for the month**. This is 41 less incidents than handled in April 2017; 153 less incidents compared to this point one year ago.

There were zero dollar loss fires in the Brookville district in April.

We assisted our neighbors on just 6 incidents, down from 31 incidents last month. Three of those were EMS responses, the other three were fire-related.

The **115** EMS responses included responses to four (4) injury crashes and two (2) non-injury crashes during the month.

We are moving into a busy time of the year. In addition to preparing to relocate all of our operations to the new building, personnel continue to respond to emergency incidents, assist residents with non-emergency needs, conduct fire safety inspections of businesses, perform public education, and train.

During April personnel completed continuing education on Vehicle Stabilization, Hybrid Vehicles, Power Saws, Salvage & Overhaul, School Bus Extrication, Bloodborne Pathogens, Capnography, Geriatrics, Heat-related Emergencies, and Hazardous Materials.

Also during the month, Lt. Colton Trego and FF/P's Matt Fahncke, Jordan Schoening, and Scott Schockman each completed the 80-hour Fire Officer 1 course instructed by the OFCA.



A roll-over crash at the intersection of SR49 & Brookville Salem Road on the afternoon of April 30th caused a significant traffic backup and brought a crash response from Brookville along with an additional medic unit from Phillipsburg to assist. Originally reported as a crash with multiple people trapped in both vehicles, crews arrived to find everyone free and only minor injuries.



For the second time in as many months, the Brookville FD assisted local law enforcement with a barricaded subject on Wolf Creek Pike in Perry Township.
