

City Manager's Update

- Firehouse Update: Landscaping began this last week. The property pins were placed as well. Substantial completion should be accomplished in a couple of weeks. Work continues on the training room audio and video equipment. The dedication remains scheduled for Sunday, July 22nd at 1:00 p.m.
- The the Arlington Road bridge replacement project is progressing. The bridge will reopen sometime in August. Made on onsite visit to the site with the Service Superintendent.
- Market Street Update: Reseeding has been completed, but more will need to be done in the bottom of the basin. Have begun fertilization, mowing, and weed control. The electrical panel for the forthcoming street lights has been installed. The street lights have been ordered, but have not arrived.
- We are awaiting the fabrication of specialized parts for the repair of the Community Theatre.
- We have received quotes for the foot bridge replacement and installation on Arlington Road. Staff recommends the bowstring design with painting. Request for Council to approve the cost.
- Attended Dayton Area Manager's Luncheon in Vandalia with an update from Terry Slaybaugh, Dayton International Airport Director, on the airport relative to flight volume, finances, and facility improvements.
- Brookville School staff completed the student tally forms needed for the Safe Routes to School Survey. Still need the completion of the parent survey.
- The mini excavator has been ordered. Given the failed levies, the budget for sidewalk replacement and resurfacing projects will need to be reduced. Arlington Road near Triggs as well as Walker Court and E. Campus Boulevard require major repair including base work.
- Reviewing resumes for the Finance Department Supervisor position and will set up interviews.
- The sink hole at the intersection of Church and Clay Streets was repaired by an outside contractor. A stormwater pipe was discovered that did not appear on any of the City's plans. Further investigation is required to determine the condition and flow of this pipe.
- Staff requests Council's input regarding the hiring of a certified waste water treatment plant operator to back up our current operator and as part of our succession planning.
- Conducted further investigation of the truck parking concerns on E. Campus Boulevard. The situation continues to escalate with trucks parking on W. Campus Boulevard as well. The Police Department is enforcing our existing parking laws. The litter and waste continue without abatement and dumpster lids at Speedway have been found open.

- Attended the Arlington Road water loop bid opening. Staff will present an award recommendation to City Council at the June meeting. This water loop will be constructed this summer. The City was awarded Ohio Public Works funding for this project.
- Attended Perry Township Trustee meeting.
- Met with engineering firm to discuss the sludge press building at the WWTP plus the inflow and infiltration concerns.
- Held a staff meeting.
- Attended the Miami Valley Regional Planning Commission Technical Advisory Committee meeting.
- Obtained a copy of the Montgomery County Thoroughfare Plan and discussed with the Service Superintendent the need for detailed planning for Upper Lewisburg Salem Road. The plan calls for a three-lane road.
- Toured the Transportation Research Center at East Liberty, Ohio.
- Attended a meeting with MKSK regarding a master plan for Golden Gate Park, Gateway Park, and the Community Theatre.
- Attended the Brookville AMVETS program and dinner for the motorcycle riders who participated in the veterans' annual "Run for the Wall" motorcycle ride from Ontario, California to Washington D.C.
- Attended I-70/I-75 Economic Development Summit.


