

**City Manager's Update**

- **Firehouse Update:** The fire department moved into the new fire station last Thursday with our 33rd and final construction update meeting. Fire Department personnel and volunteers cooked breakfast for the Council and City staff. In the evening, the department had a cookout and officially pushed the apparatus into the bays. Thanks to all who participated in this historic event. The Dayton Daily News featured our new firehouse in the Sunday edition of the paper.
- The estimated reopening of the bridge is in August. The Service Superintendent and City Manager visited the bridge to observe the progress and examined the conduit for both electric and possibly fiber.
- **Market Street Update:** The street lights have been ordered, with an estimated arrival date in July. Warranty work continues with seeding and plant replacement.
- The repairs to the community theatre are underway. The downspouts were plugged with debris. Birds and animals had infiltrated the rake system and filled the voids with nesting material. There may also be issues with the portico roof.
- The Safe Routes to School project is moving forward with parents completing the online survey. We have approximately 45 completed surveys, but need 90 to move forward with the project. The City has reached out to the Brookville Schools for assistance.
- Conducted 3 interviews for the Finance Department Supervisor position.
- Reviewed our building inspection program. This has been an ongoing process. Staff requests Council to act on Staff's recommendation to change our building department from NIC to the Montgomery County Building Department both for commercial and residential service.
- Construction on the Arlington Road Water Loop project will begin within a week. Estimated completion is two weeks after commencement. Attended the pre-construction meeting.
- Landscaping of our Parks has been completed. Our vendors did a wonderful job.
- Attended the Dayton Area Managers Association luncheon in Clayton.
- Interviewed and hired additional summer help.
