- Fire Station 76: Continuing the installation of the video equipment for the training room.
- The Arlington Road bridge opened on Friday, August 10 at 4:45 p.m.
- The Community Theatre portico roof repair is scheduled as well as the painting. The pine tree blocking the front sign has been removed providing improved visibility.
- Rod Stephan and the City Manager met with the Montgomery County Building Department regarding the transition to their services.
- Attended the Montgomery County ED/GE Renewal Advisory Committee to discuss the program and its renewal. Council has been forwarded a brief 3-page history of the program.
- Construction on the Arlington Road Water Loop project continues and is progressing well. This is the 12" waterline loop running from W. Campus north on Arlington Road to Nutrition Way. This loop will improve flow and pressure to the Northbrook Industrial Park.
- Attended the Arlington Road bridge update meeting with ODOT and Brumbaugh Construction regarding the project and outstanding items. Also participated in a Wolf Creek Road resurfacing project update with Scott Boyer at ODOT.
- The City Council retreat for City Council will take place at Wright State University on Saturday, September 15th. The retreat is an all-day retreat for the City Council with budget and economic development items on the agenda.
- Attended webinar on Civic Clerk program for the City.
- Met with Spectrum representative to discuss services for the new fire station and current billing.
- Attended the MVRPC Technical Advisory Committee meeting.
- Council has been forwarded the Safe Routes To School project schedule moving forward.
- Attended the Park Board meeting.
- Continuing work on the City budget with draft cash projections and updates from all departments on their 2019 capital improvement requests.
- Attended two Economic Development meetings.

- The Northbrook Water Tank Project is progressing well with painting this week. The City will be submitting an Ohio Public Works Commission application for funding for the third phase of this water project which is the I-70 Waterline Loop Project. Will also submit for the Maple Street Resurfacing Project.
- Continuing the interviewing process for the WWTP Class II operator position.
- Attended the Clay Township Trustee meeting.
